



1. All notes half value of original. Converted to two staves: Soprano = *Tenor* in original, up one octave; Alto = *Medius*; Tenor = *Cantus*, down one; Bass = *Bassus*.
2. Measure 5, *Bass*: last half-note changed from B to C, and the first note of m. 6 changed from A-quarter note to B-half note.
3. Measure 10, *Alto*: last note changed from B-natural to B-flat.
